

The Voting Process

This file contains the official rules according to the voting process of Study Association Off-Screen.

For official changes within Off-Screen, the association has to vote about the changes during a General Member Assembly (GMA). There are multiple main events when the official voting process is used. The voting process is used for the approval of certain organs within Off-Screen, the Board of Finance (BoF), the Application Committee (ApCo), a new Board and for changing official documents. It is only possible for the current Board to change the House Rules of Off-Screen with the consent of the members of the association.

Criteria

Article 1

1. A voting process must always follow the regulations that are drawn up in this document.
2. Only members present at the GMA will be allowed to participate in the voting process.
3. The organ inducing the vote is not allowed to partake in a vote that they have invoked.
4. Members involved in a vote are not allowed to partake in that particular vote. For example, when members are presented as a member of the nominated Board or the Application Committee.

Voting regulations

Article 2

1. The members present can decide if they officially want to partake in the voting or not. When a member decides to withhold from voting they will be excluded from the process, which means that their presence will not be counted in the total amount of votes.
2. The present members will have three voting options after they have decided if they want to partake in the voting process. The present members can vote; Blank, No and Yes.
3. Voting 'Blank' means that you do not have a clear opinion in the matter of discussion. Your vote will be part of the total votes, but it will not directly impact the result of the voting.
4. Voting 'No' means that you do not agree with the matter of discussion.
5. Voting 'Yes' means that you do agree with the matter of discussion.
6. If more than 50 percent of the present voters vote 'Yes', then the matter of discussion is accepted.
